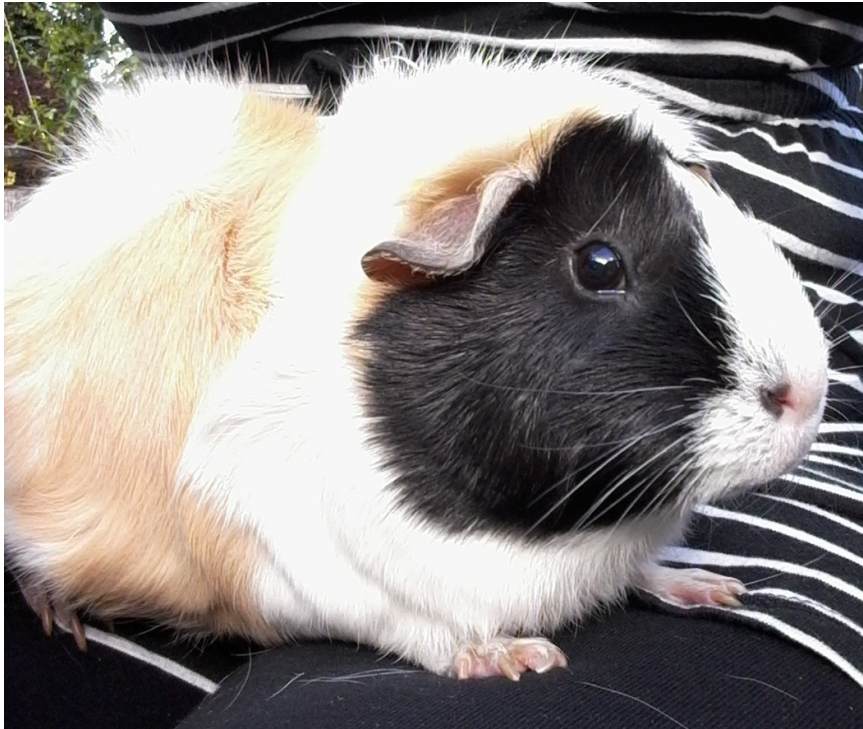

Guinea Pig (*Cavia porcellus*)

Habitat:

Grassy, rocky areas. Native to South America. Lives in underground burrows.

How we look after our pet:

A good hutch, an outdoor run, a friend to live with. Plenty of hay. Shelter and protection from the weather in winter.

Food:

Grass, hay, vegetables/fruit. Small amount of guinea pig pellets. Extra Vitamin C.

Characteristics:

Up to 40cm long. No tail. Short legs with claws on each toe. Body covered in fur. Sociable—like to be with other guinea pigs.

Why we love Nora:

Nora is a Crested Guinea Pig. She has a lovely crest of hair all along her back. She likes having her hair done, by having her crest stroked upwards.
